


A Brief History

- The Heritage Private School began in 1987 in Moni, a village near Limassol, with only six pupils.
- ► It then moved to Limassol in 1988. By then there were 22 students.
- Over time, the school expanded. By 1991, there were 207 students.
- In 2007, the school moved to its current location, 4.5 km north from Limassol town.
- Now, there are over 1200 students from 55 countries. We see interaction between different nations and cultures as vital in the modern world. Students at the Heritage are encouraged to respect each other's cultures and the Cypriot culture in which they are living.



Aims & Ethos

The aims of our school are to develop better education and skills, and to help students to reach their full potential and achieve their goals, and become well-rounded, responsible, international citizens.

- ▶ In Year 11 students take their IGCSE exams, and in Years 12 and 13 their AS and A2 Level exams.
- ▶ Also, in Year 6 and Year 9 students pass Cambridge Checkpoint exams.
